God has been faithful in our waiting this far and will continue to see us through.

As I have shared before, with my dad being a United Methodist pastor, we moved several times in my childhood. The very first memory of a church I have looks quite similar to our new church building. They had just started building when my dad was appointed there. Once it was finished, we would set up and take down folding chairs every Sunday. The lyrics for worship were on an overhead projector with transparency film. There was no stage and minimal decorations. It was nothing fancy. We left that church when I was six years old, but it solidified in me that church was a place of joy and a place where I belonged. My friends and I would run around in our dresses while our parents talked. I would sing on the top of my lungs, hearing the congregation as one echoing off the walls. The original sanctuary was still

there, in a different part of the building. Once the mold issue in the original sanctuary was taken care of, traditional services resumed in there. The few times that I slipped into that service, I felt farther away from people, disconnected, and less free to sing and dance and run. I missed our multi -purpose room worship. Most people have probably had the opposite experience. You may have worshipped in many different sanctuaries but never a space like ours. It will be different, but in a beautiful way. Our services will still look like they do now, but it will be a different feel. I invite you to continue to be excited for the new thing God is doing in us. Be open to the new possibilities God will set before us. When I think about the new building being completed, I am filled with joy and gratitude for your continued faithfulness and willingness to help our church reach people in a needed place. Let us shout for joy at the work of God's hands and we continue to get closer and closer to worshipping on Airport Road.




I would like to thank each and every one who has supported Winstead UMC this year and in years past, not only monetarily, but with your time, presence, witness, and prayers.

Let us move into our new church home and community this fall with anticipation and renewed commitment!





IN MEMORIAM

Wayne Elwin Sidelinger, of Wilson, passed away peacefully at home on Sunday, July 23, 2023.

Wayne was born in Monson, Maine on February 19, 1928 to Claude Sidelinger and Hazel Grover Sidelinger. Growing up in a small community in northern Maine, Wayne excelled in summer and winter sports. He was active in civic and social clubs that continued throughout his life.

He enlisted in the U.S. Marine Corps in 1945 at the age of 17 and served in Quantico, VA. After being honorably discharged in 1948, Wayne met his future wife Eloise Hill, originally from Johnston County, NC, while attending Ben Franklin University in Washington, DC. It was there he began working for Sherwin Williams Paint Company.

Wayne and Eloise were married on September 30, 1950 in Washington, DC. Within days of marriage, Wayne was recalled to active duty, stationed at Cherry Point and served until 1952.

In 1952, they moved to Wilson, making the decision to stay in the South to be close to Eloise's family. Wayne and Eloise were devoted to their four children. They enjoyed dancing, entertaining and planning events for various organizations in the community. Wayne also began honing his craft of restoring antique furniture in his home workshop.

In 1965, Wayne and Eloise opened The Antique Barn in Wilson. They made frequent trips to Maine to purchase antiques. In 1980, they expanded the business as The Antique Barn & Hobby Shop and worked until it closed in 2018. Wayne has always loved trains and was well-known for his skills as a railroad modeler. The train layout that he and the

Wilson Area Railroad Modelers built and operated brought visitors from all over the country.

Wayne was passionate

about civic duty. He was a member of the Wilson Jaycees, Wilson County Antique Dealers Association, a Life Member of the Wilson Evening Optimist Club, a founding member of the Wilson Area Railroad Modelers and the Golden East Railroad Modelers. He was Scout Master of BSA Troop 89 at Winstead UMC for many years.

Wayne is survived by his sons Steve Sidelinger and wife, Charla of Wilson, Michael Sidelinger and wife Adrianna of Shallotte, Lyndon Sidelinger of Roswell, GA, and daughter Nancy Sidelinger Herring and husband, Jamie of Reidsville, and grand-children Richard and wife Elizabeth, Beck and wife Jaquasha, Lauren, Sarah Catherine, Emilie, Carolyn, Troy and Victoria and great grandsons Walker and Kenai.

In addition to his parents, Wayne was preceded in death by his brother Max, granddaughter Sara Elizabeth and wife Eloise.

WINSTEAD HISTORY CORNER

Winstead United Methodist Church has a history. The history began in 1949, and it is still being made.

As we get closer to moving into our building on Airport Boulevard, we need to put our church's history into perspective, just as we are finishing the physical building, thinking about the moving process, and planning outreach activities to engage our community in the exciting move.

Following are just a few important historical points that will help us focus on the big picture of our church, its origins, purpose, and vision that the founders had in mind in 1949 when the history began.

- The founders had a vision of a place for members of the community to grow in their faith and to spread the gospel of Jesus Christ.
 Spreading the gospel was always the most important task.
- The leaders of Winstead Church have had to be problem solvers since 1949, coming up with ways to keep the church moving and evolving. Three published history pamphlets record how the church has been on the move, overcoming obstacles and solving problems while continuing to be focused on the vision set by the founders. As we prepare to move to the new building, we will find ways to celebrate the past and find excitement in the future.
- The building on Airport Boulevard will be the SIXTH structure in the history of the church.

We want to remember all the buildings in which we have carried on the work of our church: the original 3-room building built in 1949, the first sanctuary, the Fannie Perry Education Building, the second sanctuary finished in 1986, the peanut building finished in 2021, and now the building that is presently being completed on Airport Boulevard. Let us not forget our temporary meeting place, West Nash United Methodist Church during the building of the new structure. It is also part of our history. All this is history on the move.

- Our history has a good record of all the pastors who have served the church, 20 in all, ranging from Pastor Norman Vaughan to Pastor Rachel Kwashe, all of whom have been faithful to the vision of spreading the gospel of Jesus Christ to the community. We have pictures of all of them, stories of their time at our church, and memories of their contribution to the church's history.
- The history of Winstead United Methodist Church is not complete. It is still being made as we continue to "live and breathe and have our being" and to share the love of Jesus Christ with the community.

Stay tuned. There will be more in the Winstead History Corner as we celebrate the past and make our church's history in the future.


