Last month I told you that we are so close to the building being completed. While it is still in process, we are indeed in the home stretch. What I can tell you is that our final joint service with West Nash will be on **Sunday, October 15th at 10 am**. A covered dish lunch will follow. This will be our farewell to West Nash. We do not know for sure if that will be our last Sunday at West Nash, but we have planned this joint service so that we are able to say farewell and thank you before we move.

Also, within this month we will be having a congregational town hall meeting to discuss how we want to do Sunday School and worship in our new space as well as any questions or concerns you may have about our move or new building. It is preferred that you submit a question in advance, but we will also accept questions from the floor. I will send a phone tree and email when that date is finalized. Know that the Building Committee is working diligently to handle all matters relating to construction. Church Council has been simultaneously working to solidify a new mission, vision, motto, and language around what we want people outside the church to know about us and what is true of who we are right now. Our mission statement is: *Come, grow closer to God with us!* Our vision statement is: Growing in God's grace together. Our motto will be: You are welcome here, accepted here, nurtured here. You will begin to see these changes reflected in our website, bulletin, and newsletter!

In September, we focused on receiving God's invitation. In October, we will focus on extending God's invitation to others. Our stewardship theme will be based on Matthew 9:34, "The harvest is plenty, the laborers are few." We will talk about what it means for us to work together using what we have and reach out to others outside of the church. In the September newsletter, I mentioned that the consecration of our new building would be on November 12. Due to scheduling conflicts, that has been moved to Sunday, December 3 at 10:30 am. If you are able to help work the booth, we will have a sign up sheet for this event at church on Sunday's as well. These two events are going to be a lot of fun where we will not only sell our peanuts, BBQ sauce, and Randy Marshburn pottery, but also introduce our new church building to the community, and reach out to our neighbors in the Wilson Community as we invite them to come grow closer to God with us.





Moving into our new building is within sight, and in early December, we will celebrate a service of consecration for the building.

With these two events that will take place this fall, it is fitting to reflect on the dedication/ consecration services for the two former sanctuaries that served our church so well for almost seven decades.

The first sanctuary, which later became known as Hood Hall, was completed in 1954. According to our printed history book, there were only 36 members, yet that small group was able to complete the building. Much of the finishing work was done by members to cut the cost of construction. Following is an account of the service of dedication taken from the church history: "On June 27, 1954, Winstead Methodist Church was dedicated. Bishop Paul N. Garber of Richmond, Virginia, was guest speaker and presided over the Act of Dedication. The pastor, the Reverend Charles Wooten, presided over the service, with the Reverend J. F. Herbert, District Superintendent, and the Reverend Robert Bradshaw, pastor of First Methodist Church of Wilson, N.C., participating. The dedication was preceded by a fellowship supper in the education building of the church."

The second sanctuary was completed in 1986. The following is an excerpt from the Christian Advocate reporting on the consecration service: "The Winstead United Methodist Church of Wilson celebrated the Service of Consecration, Sunday, June 1, 1986. The Reverend Dr. G. Robert McKenzie, Superintendent of the Rocky Mount District of the United Methodist Church, performed the Act of Consecrating the new sanctuary after he gave the morning sermon. He said, "This beautiful place belongs to all." He also said, "I now declare this house to be open for the worship of Almighty God." The Reverend Jean Hood, pastor of the church, had led the congregation in planning and raising funds for the new sanctuary. This sanctuary was designed after Monk's Chapel of the Methodist Home for Children in Raleigh. Many of the furnishings from Monk's Chapel were transported to Wilson to be used in the new sanctuary.

As we look forward to our consecration service in December, we can be thankful for our history of faithful work and for God's presence in all we did to lead us to this new phase of Christian ministry.
