It is officially the holiday season, and this season is special for our church in a couple ways. The first is that the Church across nations, denominations, and time, has set apart the four weeks before Christmas to remember Christ's birth and prepare for the Second Coming. We call this Advent. The word "Advent" is derived from the Latin word adventus, which means 'coming.' Other words that you might associate with Advent include preparation and waiting. Every week of Advent, we light a candle with the final Christ candle being lit on Christmas Eve evening.

The other reason that this Advent is special for us is because the first Sunday of Advent is our Consecration Sunday. You all have done New Consecration Sunday in the past which pertained to stewardship and giving. The Consecration Sunday on December 3 is different because in it, we are consecrating the entire church building and the different things we use for worship like the pulpit, altar, and baptismal font. We know that God's blessing can be upon us anywhere and is not contingent on a special service. But, through the example of Scripture we see this practice of consecration of a holy place or holy things as a way to glorify God and to remind ourselves of who and why we worship. We will have prayers of consecration shared by the bishop throughout the

service. After each one, we will have a time to respond or reflect on what has been said through listening or joining in song. We will also share in the sacrament of communion. It will be a wonderful time to celebrate what God has done in getting us into our new building and to dedicate it to the Lord.

Throughout December, we will have several special Sundays and events that will be a great opportunity to invite friends, family, neighbors, and acquaintances. We will also be adding the passing of the peace into every worship service so that we can offer signs of Christ's peace and welcome to one another and to our visitors. If you are interested in being a greeter and/or staying after worship to follow-up with visitors, let me know. I would love for us to have a team to welcome anyone who visits as soon as they get to the door. We do this because God has invited us into relationship with Him and our welcome is how we extend God's invitation.

REDUCE, REUSE, RECYCLE

Years ago I watched a show of PBS called *Simple Living with Wanda Urbanska*. She talked about ways to live a more simple life and emphasized how recycling improves our lives and the world. She had one line at the end of each show that I have always felt to be true: *Nothing's too small to make a difference*.

As we move into our new facility, there will be a focus on recycling. Many events held at church

see us consuming drinks from aluminum cans or plastic bottles, or food from plastic containers. All of these can and should be recycled.

Blue recycle bins will be placed in the kitchen and peanut building. As you clean up from your event or if you brought a soda can in with you, please put rinsed recyclable items in the bin. I will sort for recycling.

The office also has a container to collect paper for recycling. But if the office is not open, place your items in the kitchen container.

Winstead has contracted with GFL Environmental Inc. to collect our trash and recycling. They accept the same items as your home recycling. All items need to be clean and dry.

- Steel and aluminum cans
- Glass bottles and jars

- #1-#7 plastics (milk, soft drink, detergent bottles, etc.), just look for the recycle emblem on the container
- Newspapers and inserts, magazines, white paper, phone books, junk mail (but not thermal printed receipts)
- Cardboard and paperboard (cereal, moving boxes, shipping boxes, etc.)
- No pizza boxes and why no pizza boxes?
 They tend to be contaminated with grease and

grease is the worst thing to find in recycled cardboard. Recyclers don't have time to check every box to see if it has grease.

Plastic bags are in a different category. Plastic will go to grocery store bins. They are for recycling grocery bags, but that's not all that can go in

those bins. Other plastics include zipper bags, bread wrappers, bubble wrap, case wrap, cereal liners, dry cleaning bags, newspaper bags, stretch wrap, produce bags, Tyvek envelopes, or any bag marked #2 or #4. All items need to be clean and dry.

If you have any questions, please ask me. Recycling reduces the waste that we pay to have hauled away and is good for the planet.

Nothing's too small to make a difference.

Our congregation will be invited to a book-wrapping party on Tuesday, December 12 at 10:00 am and 7:00 pm, so that all may have a chance to help. Those who wish to participate in this fun event should bring their own scissors and tape. Wrapping paper will be provided. This will be a good time to pray for each child who will receive a book this year.
