

On April 22nd, I will travel to Charlotte to attend General Conference. General Conference happens every four years and has its roots in the conferences that John Wesley called together for clergy to gather and make decisions for the future of the Methodist movement. Years later, lay delegates would become an essential part of General Conference with both a voice and a vote.

The Annual Conference meets yearly and includes every pastor and at least one lay person from every church in that region. The North Carolina Conference covers everything east of Elon, Mt. Gilead, and Rockingham. The Western NC Conference covers west of Greensboro. There are 129 Annual Conferences worldwide that send lay and clergy delegates to General Conference, according to the size of each Annual Conference. The structure is like the House of Representatives, in which the number of elected officials vary by population.

One of the things I am most looking forward to is witnessing firsthand the joy of what we call "the connection." When we say that we are connectional, we are referencing our commitment to partner with other United Methodist churches around the world in mission and ministry. United Methodists are connectional because we believe that Jesus' command in Matthew 28 to make disciples of all nations was not a metaphor or sug-

gestion. We are commanded, not just invited, to be a connectional people. For the local church to bear witness to Christ in the world, it must tend to the needs of its location but also look to the needs of our sisters and brothers around the world.

In our over 200-year history, the UMC and its predecessors have never delayed General Conference by more than one year. Because of COVID-19, it has been delayed by four years. The biggest reason for this delay was our commitment to full representation of the United Methodist Church and for the health and well-being of all delegates. Because we are all part of the body of Christ, we do not put one people group above another. We believe that faithful discussion and decision-making can only happen when everyone has a place at the table and the resources to get to the table.

In the coming weeks, you may see information about General Conference on social media or in the news. When that happens, I ask that you refer to umnews.org or nccumc.org/gc for the most accurate and up-to-date information. Please also reach out to me if you have questions or concerns about General Conference. I'm more than happy to talk with you about it.



WINSTEAD HISTORY CORNER

After Winstead Methodist Church was established in 1949, the members began to set up committees, programs, and elements that helped the church grow and serve the community in Christian life. Following is a list of "firsts" that became traditions within the church and the community.

- On January 10, 1950, Misses Clee and Zell Winstead organized the first women's group of the church: the Woman's Society of Christian Service (later knows as Winstead United Methodist Women).
- The first Vacation Bible School was held during the last week of June in 1950, under the direction of Miss Clee Winstead. Eight adult workers and 27 children participated. Offerings from the week were used to purchase the first pulpit Bible for the church.
- On July 30, 1950, a Communion Service Dedication was held. The Communion Service was presented by the Wesleyan Service Guild of the First Methodist Church in Wilson.
- The first revival service was held in the fall of 1950, with the Reverend Daniel Boone serving as revival preacher.

- The first Methodist Youth Fellowship was organized by Mrs. Lawrence Green and Mrs. John Rosser on June 20, 1951.
- A bell for the church steeple was donated by Mrs. James Durham, Jr. Spotlights for the front of the church were donated by Mrs. Opie Ellen in 1957.
- Boy Scout Troup 89 was established at the church in 1959.
- The Methodist Men unit was chartered in February 1959.
- In 1968, the church officially became Winstead United Methodist Church as the result of a merger of the Methodist Church and the Evangelical United Brethren.
- In 1970 the church had its first Lay Witness Mission. Also in 1970, the first Chrismon Tree was decorated, and that tradition has continued each year since.

Other traditions and programs were established as the church grew, added new buildings, and continued to be a center of Christian education, worship, outreach, and service to the community.

Next month, the history focus will be the buildings that have been added since the church was established in 1949.
