Dear Church,

You have been part of so many of my "firsts." Some were expected and some were unexpected, but God worked through all of them. Now, I am experiencing yet another "first" which is sharing the news of my first reappointment. The pastoral appointment system is the only system I have ever known. It was something I was first born into and then one that I chose. I distinctly remember standing outside the new church nursery at six years old after yet another move thinking, "What could possibly make someone do this to their family?" It was in my call to ministry at ten years old that I found the answer. I was overcome with the grace of God as I read my Bible to myself in Mr. Mills' 6th grade public classroom. It was at that moment that I realized this overwhelming grace of God made available for all people is what God had sent my dad to tell the world. God needed my dad in each place to help people learn how much God loved them. In that realization came what I could only describe as the Holy Spirit saying, "That's what I need you to do too."

At least once a year for the eight years I was in the ordination process, I had to explain my commitment to itinerancy, which is a fancy word for moving. Despite how hard it can be to leave a place, I believe that God is at work through this process and the guiding force behind it. Even Jesus was itinerant, preaching in several different places, not putting down roots in one single place during his ministry. Last year in my ordination papers I wrote:

Kuda and I both know that we are where God has called us to be for this season and will continue to go wherever we are sent in the future. Through Winstead, I know that the Spirit worked through the Cabinet to lead me exactly where I was called to go. I will continue to trust that God will lead both Kuda and I where God calls us to go in the future.

In the United Methodist Church, a pastoral move can be initiated by the pastor, the Staff Parish Relations Committee, or happen independently of the two in cases of specific need (i.e., a pastor dies unexpectedly). In this case, it was initiated by me due to my family needs. Kuda's churches are not able to continue supporting his positions which necessitated his reappointment. While I had hoped to be at Winstead longer, I told the district superintendent and cabinet that I would rather be reappointed if it meant that Kuda and I could be closer in distance and both remain in full-time appointments. Kuda and I have been working with

distance constraints for all four years that I've been at Winstead. We have stretched as far as we could and while for a time, we thought we could keep going like this, we have accepted that this change may be a gift, despite the grief that comes with it.

You will always be my first church. You will always be in my heart. I am committed to doing everything I can in the time I have left here to equip you and your next pastor with what you all need to continue moving forward into the hopefilled future that God has for you. Know that in this time, I am still here with you and for you. Most importantly, God is still here and He will continue to be faithful through you.

Usually, when it is announced that a pastor is leaving, it is also announced who is coming behind them. When Randy Marshburn announced that Pastor George was moving in April of 2021, he told you who I was and what he had been told about me. This is not always the case. Sometimes, it takes longer. This year is one of those cases. It was announced in worship on April 27 that I am being reappointed but we do not yet know who will take my place. The bishop and cabinet want to ensure they are taking the time to listen to God's

leading and not rushing just for the sake of knowing a name. I know that it is hard not to know. But, there is still time. God is known to work during seasons of waiting. As you receive this news of my reappointment, I ask that you be open to God's work during the wait for the name of your new pastor. Pray for them. Pray for our church. Know that God will make a way.

In John 16:33, Jesus says to his disciples:

"I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world."

Take heart! God is still making all things new.
