Coalescing

For whatever was written in former days was written for our instruction, so that by steadfastness and by the encouragement of the scriptures we might have hope. May the God of steadfastness and encouragement grant you to live in harmony with one another, in accordance with Christ Jesus, that together you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.

-Romans 15:4-6

Unboxing the Nativity scene and arranging its many parts has become a kind of liturgy for my family, a "together act" that focuses us on the season's main event: the incarnation of Jesus.

As we unwrap each figure we talk about their significance. Mary, the girl whom God chose to carry and birth the messiah Jesus into a broken world. Joseph, who guarded Mary's divine purpose with devotion and deference against the expectations of both religion and culture. The angel, who announced to the world that Jesus was born. Then the sheep, whose presence symbolizes the kind of savior Jesus would be. And the dogs... I'll admit, the other animals require a bit more creativity to tease out their significance, but you get the idea.

Over the years our Nativity scene has grown to include even some out-of-place characters. We have a figure of the prophet Isaiah, for example, who lived centuries before Jesus was born. Yet his placement matters because the voice of the prophets signaled a future in which God would rectify injustice and its wounds through the coming of an appointed messiah.

Then there's John the Baptist, fully grown ahead of his time, covered in camel's hair and wearing a leather belt (no locusts, thankfully). He hauls a satchel of wheat on his back, preparing the way for Jesus, who would soon burst onto the scene to separate "the wheat from the chaff," and announce God's Kingdom.

These out-of-place characters remind us to look backward and forward from the Nativity to consider the ways God has always been faithful and present to God's people. The idea is that we would consider how God has been faithful in our own lives and for the world.

Until that holiest of nights, however, one figure remains notably absent. Can you guess which?

Yes, Jesus. Until Christmas Eve the manger remains empty, reminding us to watch and wait for Christ's coming so that, as Paul writes in Romans, "by steadfastness and encouragement of the scriptures we might have hope." That evening after worship we place Jesus in his humble cradle,

I love that our scene has become such a coalescing of biblical characters and periods of time. After all that's what the coming of Christ is: a coalescing of time and divine purpose. As the hymn says, "The hopes and fears of all the years are met in Thee tonight."

As we journey through Advent and prepare for Christmas, my prayer this year is that we would contemplate the cosmic significance of the incarnation of Christ, how it is a coming together of time and divine purpose. For in Jesus the longings and hopes of the world took on flesh in a vulnerable baby enthroned in a manger in a small town tucked away in an insignificant corner of the world. Even in times like these, where the world seems a mess, and attending to our lives feels heavy, even here, even now Christ comes.


